

Importance of Resources Classification

Sustainable Resource Management (SRM) is critical to deliver the UN Agenda 2030 and its Sustainable Development Goals

Begins with mapping and classifying the mineral deposits

based on

relevant, consistent, transparent and comparable raw material information



The United Nations Framework Classification for Resources


UNFC

UNFC is an international scheme for the classification, management and reporting of energy and raw material resources

UNFC is based on 3 fundamental criteria

- **E axis**: Environmental-socio-economic viability
- F axis: Technical Feasibility
- G axis: Degree of Confidence
 - 1. Definitions: Classification framework
 - 2. Specifications: Application rules
 - 3. Guidelines: Non-mandatory guidance

UNFC Resource Specifications

Primary and Secondary Raw Materials

UNFC is applied to all energy and resources projects


Specifications provide additional details as to how a resource classification system is to be applied, supplementing the framework definitions of that system

Minerals Specifications

Used to clarify for the correct application of UNFC and justification of the UNFC Category and/or Subcategory for a mineral project.

Anthropogenic Resources Specifications

Used for the correct application of UNFC in the context of the anthropogenic resource, material, project, process, and anthropogenic material system.






UNFC Bridging Documents

Raw Materials

Aligned System - A classification system that has been aligned with UNFC as demonstrated by the existence of a Bridging Document that has been endorsed by EGRM

A document that explains the relationship between UNFC and another classification system, including instructions and guidelines on how to classify estimates generated by application of that system using the UNFC Numerical Codes





UNFC Guidance Europe

Overview

What is **UNFC Guidance Europe**?

Document for regional and national authorities to establish and maintain a project-based inventory of primary and secondary raw material projects (minerals and anthropogenic resources) in Europe using UNFC.

Whom is the **UNFC Guidance Europe** for?



Public-sector decision-making ranging from onsite, municipality, regional, country, European and the UN level on aspects of the resource life cycle



Economic management for planning and leading activities of management at all corporate levels





Finance investment decision making considering economic, environmental, and social aspects of raw material projects

UNFC allows

consistent comparison within and across multiple commodities



Globally deployed and endorsed by the UN ECOSOC for application



Simple to use

3 categories (E, F, G) lead to 3 basic classes (viable, potentially viable, non-viable).




Combines all resources such as **energy**, **minerals and ground water** into one global classification system



Informs on **environmental**, **social** and **governmental issues** at **local**, **regional**, and **national level**

UNFC improves financial resilience through business process innovation

UNFC derives necessary social, environmental, and economic outcomes



UNFC speeds up decision-making, rendering it more rational, efficient, predictable, and safe. It makes information processing simpler as it integrates a resource management approach





Extractive Wastes

EU Critical Raw Materials Act Proposal

As part of National measures on circularity, CRM recovery

from extractive wastes is encouraged – UNFC is required

when reporting on extractive waste facilities.

UNFC Provisions

UNFC Provisions UNFC Post-Enactment UNFC is key in the recognition of Strategic Projects – **Project** Article 5: Criteria for recognition of Strategic Projects promoters are required to classify their projects in UNFC for **Strategic Projects** the Strategic Project Application to the Commission. Member States will have to intensify their National Article 18: National **National Exploration** *exploration programmes* Exploration Programs – Exploration results are required to **Projects** be reported in UNFC New and existing projects are to be reported by the Article 20: Information obligations for monitoring **Risk Monitoring** Member States to the Commission – UNFC is obligatory for monitoring new projects.
